Parent Code of Conduct



Northville Academic Games (AG) is a parent-run program. All coaches and coordinators are parent volunteers and they are not compensated by the district in any manner. Parents of players also play an important role in supporting this program. In order to run the program successfully, every parent is expected to abide by the following code of conduct:

- 1. Parents embrace Northville Academic Games Mission Statement.
- 2. Parents support Northville AG Player Code of Conduct.
- 3. Parents are responsible for getting and picking up their child to all classes in a timely manner without causing any inconvenience to coaches or other volunteers.
- 4. Parents will volunteer a certain number of hours set forth by each school program. Responsibilities includes but are not limited to: assist supervising students during practice and/or tournament; organize games and supplies; buy and distribute snacks; supervise players to clean up after practice; volunteer as chaperones and help with state and/or national tournament.
- 5. Northville schools are NOT involved in team formation or player evaluation. Parents should understand that coaches do their best in coaching and have final judgment in team formation and other team matters. If parents disagree with coach, they should address directly with coach outside practice or tournament time. If the matter cannot be resolved between the parent and the coach, then the school coordinator can be brought in to help resolve any concerns or issues.
- 6. Academic Games is a team event. Team work and behaviors at practices and regional tournaments will considered for state and national team formation. Coach reserves rights to dismiss a student from a team if the student negatively impacts team practice and fails to follow coach instruction repeatedly.
